CHECKLIST

Inspiration for a story can come from anywhere. I truly believe that finishing a good story, does not always need a checklist.

But, if you are new, have an idea and have not started writing your story yet, or are stuck at a point, this checklist (or portions of it) are meant to help you find a path to completion.

Setting and Audience

Being clear on the age group and theme of the story will help with the the entire process.

- Read similar styled books
- Opecide on target audience
- What's the theme?
- Think of character(s') traits
- Set the story tone, voice



Start Writing

If you haven't already started, start now. What you haven't identified sometimes falls right into place when you let the words flow onto paper.

- Make mistakes!

 Write and finish a first draft
- If stuck, deliberately try imbalanced characters and strange plot changes
- Read more, and research visuals
- Finally, challenge yourself to simplify and cut down

Story Structure

Introducing the main character right away? Or setting the scene first? First-person or third-person? Such critical questions will build the story arc right, from the start.

- O How do you start the story?
- Plan the conflict point
- O Identify resolution
- Openine the story arc
- Are you limited in word count?

Revise and Illustrate

Read, and re-read. Ask family and friends to read. Change what makes sense to change, and leave in what feels right to you. Think of imagery as you now revise.

- Read the copy out loud & again after a 1-2 week break
- Review vocabulary and flow
- Revise and have it peer-reviewed
- Build illustration notes
